SPELLINGS

- Pupils will have spellings each night (Monday Thursday).
- Thursday night will be a revision of all spellings.
- Spellings are to be written out three times each into the English Homework book. Pupils are encouraged to use the Look, Copy, Cover, Write and Check technique.

TABLES

- A set of number bonds moving onto tables will be put on Seesaw each Monday.
- These have to be written out once each into your Maths Homework book and should be learned and checked by an adult.

READING

• Pupils will choose an Accelerated Reading book to read at their own pace and return the book when they are ready for an online quiz. Pupils should aim to read a book and complete a quiz each week.

WRITTEN HOMEWORK

- Monday– Numeracy activity on Seesaw. Occasionally a World Around Us, RE, Arts or other homework activity may be set on Seesaw.
- Tuesday Spelling activity sheet 1:5 (week 1), 2:5 (week 2), 3:5 (week 3) etc
- Wednesday Spelling activity sheet 1:6 (week 1), 2:6 (week 2), 3:6 (week 3) etc

GENERAL INFORMATION

In P.4 your child should be encouraged to complete all written work independently. With written homework we prefer to receive the <u>child's</u> best effort, however parents can be supportive by further explaining and supervising the task, if required. Once completed, an adult should check their work, ask their spellings and tables, and listen to them reading. <u>Please send us a picture of your completed</u> <u>homework on Seesaw.</u>

HANDWRITING

Pupils will continue to develop pre-cursive writing skills and will use this in all written work. Pupils will move on from using pre-cursive to developing joined-writing skills. Letter formation will be practised in school.

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Nettlefield Primary School Anti – Bullying Procedures

As a school, we are very pro-active concerning the issue of bullying. All classes are taught not to engage in such behaviour, but also what to do, should it unfortunately still occur. When an incident is reported, the following will take place:

The class teacher will speak to the bully and the victim involved. Bystanders may also be involved in this discussion. Clear guidance will be given that this type of behaviour should cease immediately. If a child (victim) is distressed at this level – parents will be informed. The parent of the bully will be contacted immediately to ensure the incident is dealt with at home.

Should this type of incident continue, the class teacher will inform the Head of Stage/Vice Principal/Principal. The bully will be punished in line with our Positive Behaviour Policy and parents will be invited into school for a meeting. No child will be permitted to persistently annoy/upset another child in our school.

The positive ethos encouraged helps to eradicate the need for this type of behaviour but when it occurs, both the victim and the bully get help to ensure it does not continue. A bully often has other issues and these will be investigated to ensure this behaviour pattern stops.
